What we do	
How does Spruce protect my personal information?	To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.
How does Spruce collect my personal information?	We collect your personal information, for example, when you:  • open an account  • pay your bills  • use your credit or debit card  • provide account information  • give us your contact information  We also collect personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, your contractor or installer, our affiliates, or other companies.

What happens when I limit sharing for an account I hold jointly with someone else?	Your choices will apply to everyone on your account.

Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.  • Our affiliates include companies with a common corporate identity of Spruce; including but not limited to: financial companies such as Solar Service Experts, LLC, Spruce Lending, Inc., and Spruce Servicing, LLC; and non-financial companies such as Spruce Power 1, LLC and Spruce Power 3, LLC.
Non-affiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial or nonfinancial companies.  • Nonaffiliates we share with can include account servicing and billing vendors, internet service providers, government entities, and external auditors
Joint Marketing	<ul> <li>A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.</li> <li>Our joint marketing partners may include home improvement, energy efficiency, water conservation other renewable energy companies, and other institutions such as lenders.</li> </ul>
